Four different block sets. Transpose at will.

 - Bm7b5:** Fret 7, strings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Muted strings 1, 2.
 - E7:** Fret 7, strings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Muted strings 1, 2.
 - Am:** Fret 5, strings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Muted strings 1, 2.
 - Dm7b5:** Fret 5, strings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Muted strings 1, 2.
 - G7:** Fret 5, strings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Muted strings 1, 2.
 - Cm:** Fret 5, strings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Muted strings 1, 2.

Above chords can also work for mandola or CGDA tenor banjo/Octave tuning
